The adverse consequences of global warming affect everyone. If climate engineering/geoengineering is being postulated as a potential intercession in the arsenal of global warming interventions - which must also include mitigation and adaptation - the Centre for Science and Citizenship (CSC) believes that it is vitally important that the people of New Zealand understand the associated technologies and what social, cultural, spiritual, ethical, legal and environmental impacts there might be. The public's voice must be integral to any consideration of geoengineering technologies and the development of policy positions in this regard.

The CSC understands that the research into climate engineering/geoengineering proposed through the CLEINZ Project includes significant public engagement with a strong emphasis on public deliberation over four of the project's five years.
